The Launch of the NSW Government's Ageing Strategy - Peter O'Reilly and Jo Topfer, East Sydney Community College; Gabrielle Upton, MP, Member for Vaucluse; The Hon Andrew Constance, MP Minister for Ageing; Ian Day, CEO COTA; Nan Bosler, ASCCA President.

Our ASCCA President Nan Bosler was excited to be part of the NSW Minister for Ageing & Disability Services Andrew Constance's Press Conference to launch events for the NSW Ageing Strategy on 9th July. This strategy encompasses a whole-of-government approach to help seniors live healthy, active and socially connected lives.

Mr. Constance said; "We need to capitalise on the opportunities that population ageing will bring. People who reach 65 today have the opportunity to enjoy more years of healthy, active living than any generation before them."

"By up-skilling seniors on the latest technology, we can help them to become more connected with their families and friends and their local communities."

The Minister announced that part of the strategy includes \$500,000 to fund low cost training programs to help seniors become 'tech savvy'. Nan Bosler said; "This funding provided to help seniors become Tech Savvy is exciting. It is imperative that the plans to disperse this welcome \$500,000

be developed across a number of options because Seniors learn in different ways! ASCCA is well placed to provide senior friendly training at a cost that will not discriminate against those with limited fixed incomes. With more and more Government departments depending on their websites to disseminate and seek information from Australia's older residents we are keen to make sure that seniors are not disadvantaged because they haven't yet learned how to access the internet."

A new grants program will also be established as part of the Strategy to help local councils build age-friendly communities focusing on accessible town centres.

Mr. Constance said that an ageing community has big implications for health, transport and urban planning and that a whole-of-government approach would be taken in implementing the strategy.

Organised crime groups are targeting the retirement savings of elderly Australians with sophisticated <u>fraud operations</u>.

Typically based overseas, the fraudsters initiate contact over the phone and use an array of persuasive techniques to build trust with victims, before enticing them to transfer funds into bogus investments.

Experienced and inexperienced investors alike

are at risk. Authorities confirm that more than 2,600 mainly elderly Australians have fallen victim to the fraud (as at June, 2012). The average individual loss is around \$42,348, but losses range from \$35,000 to \$4 million.

Total losses are believed to be higher than the reported \$113 million to date, because many victims are unwilling or too embarrassed to report their loss.

To combat the fraud, the <u>Australian Crime</u> <u>Commission Board</u> has established a high-level taskforce involving key Government agencies and police bodies.

WorkVentures launches "i.settle.with.IT" program

ASCCA Board Member Eric Whitehouse recently attended the launch of WorkVentures (Microsoft supported) i.settle.with.IT! website which has been established to offer migrants and refugees the IT tools and resources necessary to adapt to the Australian workplace. Senator the Hon. Kate Lundy, Minister for Sport, Minister for Multicultural Affairs, Minister Assisting for Industry and Innovation, launched this site at the Auburn Centre for Community on Saturday 14th July.

Eric was very impressed with the possibilities of this program which provides an innovative way for newly arrived migrants to acquire the skills needed to settle into the Australian way of life and be equipped to find work. At their own speed, students can use this site www.isettlewithit.com to learn the basic skills of computing while learning to write English as a second language - up to 3 levels of efficiency.

Eric says; "There are also some newly arrived

immigrant seniors in our communities who would dearly love to know how to use a computer. They want to access newspapers in their native language, but don't have the necessary skills. And their English is not good enough to learn how by attending our Seniors Computer Clubs. There is now a new way to achieve both – learn English and computing skills.

The program starts with the basics (how to use a mouse and a keyboard), and incorporates videos and games to enhance skills as the student progresses. Have a look at it and see what you think. Introduce the site to someone you know who wants to benefit."

Eric suggests that the computer part of the program is such that it could even help senior English speaking students who may be worried about their ability to use computers. He recommends it for any of our ASCCA members who meet refugees/immigrants with limited English and a desire to learn computing.

FREE help for seniors to save power and money

The New South Wales State Government has developed a Home Power Saving Program for NSW residents who have a Centrelink Pensioner Concession, Low Income Health Care, Veterans' Affairs Pensioner Concession or Veterans' Affairs (Gold or White) Repatriation Health card, or are renting government or community housing or are on a hardship assistance plan with their energy retailer. The intention of the program is to provide free help to 220,000 households on a lower income to reduce their electricity bills by June 2013.
