**David LEONARD**, who was the founder of the **Hills of Gold Computer Club** at Nundle was honoured on Australia Day with a Medal of the Order of Australia (OAM) for service to the community of Nundle. Although Nundle and nearby Hanging Rock have only a small population of about 300 people, this is an area where many tourists like to stop off and enjoy the beautiful countryside and all the history of this 1850s to 1889 Gold Rush area at the start of the Fossicker's Way Touring Route.

It is because of the enthusiasm and community building efforts of David and the people who have worked with him in the small but important organisations mentioned in his Official Citation, that more and more tourists are discovering that Nundle is a lovely place to visit.
