ASCCA has developed a program called **Seniors West Australian Digital Expansion (SWADE)** to help older Australians embrace the benefits and satisfaction of using technology. A **Be**



Connected Capacity Builder Grant has been received by **ASCCA** to allow the expansion of their work in this state. **ASCCA** is determined to continue to digitally empower older Australians living in Western Australia.

The *Be Connected* program has replaced the recently ended *Broadband for Seniors Program*. *Good Things Foundation* won the contract to be the National Network Manager for the **Digital Literacy for Older Australians program – Be Connected**. **ASCCA** Clubs will be receiving phone calls introducing the new program and explaining how your club can become involved in this Commonwealth funded project.
