Congratulations to ASCCA Trainer Jean Martin who most successfully delivered the first session of teaching participants on the finer points of becoming Digital Mentors in the Be Connected program.



Jean is herself a Lead Digital Mentor, but the program was new to her and it required

considerable preparation in order to meet the requirements. The group of Digital Mentors who were trained mid August were Sydney University Students from various faculties, who were members of the newly formed group Square One Skills.



SOS has also registered as a not for profit group and a Be Connected Network Partner.

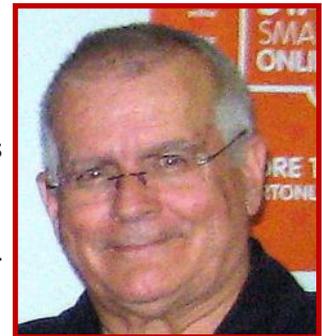

Our club ran its very first intergenerational learning 1 on 1 session this afternoon, Monday 5 August 2019. Today's group, 10 out of the 40 participants couldn't wait to get started and were astounded how quickly their 1 hour flew. All the mentees said they learnt so much in such a short time and enjoyed their time also chatting to get to know their young mentor. There were smiles all round and the mentees and even the mentors took notes for homework preparing for when they return the same time and place next week for the next 9 weeks. I personally couldn't be happier with the success of today's session and could only put it down to the well planned and thought through program outlined by Be Connected and the wonderfully keen high school students from Northern Beaches Secondary College. My special thanks to Jessie for helping facilitate this first session of our Young Mentors Pilot Program.

This handbook was developed by the Queensland University of Technology in 2018-19 with support from Australia Post, in close consultation with digital mentors working in community organisations, libraries and homes across Victoria, New South Wales and Queensland.



ASCCA organised the workshop to launch the handbook at Narrabeen. Mentors/trainers from Computer Clubs for Seniors from Avalon, Belrose & Terrey Hills, Manly, Northern Beaches (who hosted the event), and Forest participated. Nan Bosler and Ross Bell from ASCCA were also part of this initial workshop.

This handbook has been designed to provide Mentors with knowledge and resources to support their journey as a digital mentor. The information and suggested activities are backed by the latest research on digital mentoring, including national and international best practice.
